BOARD MINUTES OCTOBER 16TH CONTINUED

Report from Fire Board Representative

The Fire Board discussed and approved the 2024 Fire Department Budget with a 2% increase resulting in \$84,359.47 to be assessed to the three municipalities.

The Board also approved for the Fire Chief Colin Feuster and Assistant Chief Larry Zais to bid \$51,800 for the used Wet Rescue Vehicle in Stuart, Iowa.

Report from Elk Mound/Colfax Solid Waste & Recycling

The unit is in the process of notifying the residents of the nine municipalities that clear bags for disposal of garbage/trash will be mandatory starting January 1. The unit is giving residents one free 1.5 mil 33 gallon clear bag. These bags will also be for sale at the Colfax and Elk Mound disposal sites and Village Halls. The cost is \$1.00 for 3 bags.

Winter preparation is now being performed at each site. New permits, fee schedules and educational materials will be made available to the residents of the RU in the near future.

Colfax Rescue Squad Monthly Report

The Colfax Rescue Squad Monthly Report was not available at the time of the meeting.

Community Center/Library Report

Terry Stamm reported that the Community Center/Library Board met on September 25. Julie Conlin reported that she plans to reapply in 2024 for a grant for the screen replacement.

Library staff have asked the Board to consider the installation of a drinking fountain at the Community Center. This item will be placed on the next Community Center/Library Board agenda.

Communications & Miscellaneous Business as

<u>Permitted by Law:</u> Clerk-Treasurer Karin Wolf mentioned plans to go live with the new village website early next week.

Director of Public Works Mark Levra reported that hydrant flushing took place last week and that the water is still potable during this process. The wastewater treatment plant is also experiencing high amounts of ammonia. The Public Works Department is working with the Wisconsin Rural Water Association to identify the source of the ammonia.

President Terry Stamm reported that the Village Assessor Bowmar Appraisals will begin the revaluation process soon. Also, the topic of going from two meetings to one meeting per month will be on the next Board agenda.

<u>Unfinished Business:</u> There was no unfinished business.

New Business:

<u>Discussion/Action Installation of Wayne Dalton</u> <u>Counter Shutters at Village Park Serving Area</u>

Benjamin/Price moved and seconded a motion to approve the purchase and installation of Wayne Dalton Counter Shutters at the Village Park serving area at a cost of \$8,490 using funds from the Park Savings account. Motion carried.

Citizen's Forum

Jon Chisholm from the Elk Mound Youth Baseball program thanked the Village Board for the use of the facilities for the 2023 baseball season. He also announced his intent to hold a 2-3 day youth baseball tournament at the Village Park in June of 2024. He asked the Board to consider waiving the park rental fees as the funds raised during the baseball tournament will be given back to the village for the possible addition of another ball field and maintenance/updates to current fields and batting cages. This will be placed on a future Board agenda.

<u>Public Appearance:</u> There was no Public Appearance.

<u>Communications & Miscellaneous Business as</u> Permitted by Law

Director of Public Works Mark Levra reported that there are mechanical issues with the skid steer, and it is currently at the Diesel Repair Shop.

Police Chief Chad Weinberger reported that the village did not receive the COPS grant to help fund a school resource officer.

President Terry Stamm reported that the solid waste sites will now have the same hours year-round. Because of some miscommunication, the sites will open at noon on Wednesdays for at least two weeks.

ORDINANCE REMINDER WINTER PARKING

Per Sec. 10-1-29 (b) Winter Parking Restricted:

- (1) No person shall park a vehicle on streets or portions of streets within the Village of Elk Mound, between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., from November 1 through April 1, the snow removal season, except as follows:
 - a) On odd-numbered calendar days, on that side of the street with oddnumbered house numerals; and
 - b) On even-numbered calendar days, on that side of the street with even numbered house numerals.
- (2) In addition to the penalties of Section 10-1-50, Village officials may remove any such vehicle parked in violation of this Section to a place of storage and may charge the cost of towing and storage to the owner of such vehicle.

ORDINANCE REMINDER

Sec. 6-2-8 Snow and Ice Removal.

- (a) Removal From Sidewalks. Within twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of any fall of sleet or snow, it shall be the duty of the owners and/or the occupants of any lot or parcel of land in the Village of Elk Mound to remove, or cause to be removed, the snow or sleet from any and all sidewalks and the nearest cross-side-walks adjacent to the premises of such owner or occupant, and to keep the same free and clear of snow and ice for the full width of the sidewalk.
- (b) Failure to Remove. In case of failure or neglect of any owner or occupant of any land or parcel of land to remove the snow from sidewalks as specified in subsection (a) within the time set forth in said Subsection and, after twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of any fall of snow, the owner or occupant has failed to remove such snow from sidewalks as specified in Subsection (a), the Public Works Department shall remove or cause the snow to be removed from any and all sidewalks and cross-sidewalks that may be so neglected by the owner or occupant, and a fee established by the Village Board shall be assessed against the owner or occupant for the cost and expense of moving such snow. The fee will be charged against the respective lots and parcels of land adjacent to which said work shall be done, as a special charge, and such sum or sums shall be collected in the same manner as other special taxes.
